

# **SDI** definition

"We invest in solutions that contribute to the UN Sustainable Development Goals. These investments meet our financial risk and return requirements and support the generation of positive social and/or environmental impact through their products and services, or at times through acknowledged transformational leadership. We distinguish between investments where impact has and those where it has not been measured, and stimulate the latter to report on measurable impacts."






#### **SDG 1: No Poverty**

# End poverty in all its forms everywhere

- **1.4**: Ensure that all men and women, in particular the poor and the vulnerable, have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to basic services, ownership and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology and financial services, including microfinance
- **1.5**: Build the resilience of the poor and those in vulnerable situations and reduce their exposure and vulnerability to climate-related extreme events and other economic, social and environmental shocks and disasters






### **SDG 2: Zero Hunger**

# End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

- 2.1: Ensure access by all people to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round
- **2.2**: End all forms of malnutrition and address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women and older persons
- **2.3**: Double the agricultural productivity and incomes of small-scale food producers, including through secure and equal access to land, other productive resources and inputs, knowledge, financial services, markets and opportunities for value addition and non-farm employment
- **2.4**: Ensure sustainable food production systems and implement resilient agricultural practices that increase productivity and production
- **2.5**: Maintain the genetic diversity of seeds, cultivated plants and farmed and domesticated animals and their related wild species, and promote access to and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources and associated traditional knowledge





# SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being

# Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

- **3.1**: Reduce the global maternal mortality ratio
- 3.2: End preventable deaths of newborns and children under 5 years of age
- **3.3**: End the epidemics of AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria and neglected tropical diseases and combat hepatitis, water-borne diseases and other communicable diseases
- **3.4**: Reduce by one third premature mortality from non-communicable diseases through prevention and treatment and promote mental health and well-being
- **3.7**: Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health-care services, including for family planning, information and education
- **3.8** Achieve universal health coverage, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all.
- **3.9**: Substantially reduce the number of deaths and illnesses from hazardous chemicals and air, water and soil pollution and contamination
- **3.b**: Research and development of vaccines and medicines for the communicable and non-communicable diseases that primarily affect developing countries, provide access to affordable essential medicines and vaccines




# **SDG 4: Quality education**

# Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities

- **4.1**: Ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes
- **4.2**: Ensure that all girls and boys have access to quality early childhood development, care and pre-primary education so that they are ready for primary education
- **4.3**: Ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university
- **4.4**: Substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship
- **4.5**: Eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations
- **4.6**: Ensure that all youth and a substantial proportion of adults, both men and women, achieve literacy and numeracy
- **4.a**: Build and upgrade education facilities that are child, disability and gender sensitive and provide safe, non-violent, inclusive and effective learning environments for all










# **SDG 5: Gender equality**

### Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls

#### Investable and acknowledged transformational leadership sub-goals

- **5.1**: End all forms of discrimination against women
- 5.5: Ensure women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership
- **5.6**: Access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights






#### SDG 6: Clean water and sanitation

# Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

- **6.1**: Access to safe and affordable drinking water for all
- **6.2**: Access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations
- **6.3**:Improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping and minimizing release of hazardous chemicals and materials, halving the proportion of untreated wastewater and substantially increasing recycling and safe reuse globally
- **6.4**: Substantially increase water-use efficiency across all sectors and ensure sustainable withdrawals and supply of freshwater to address water scarcity and substantially reduce the number of people suffering from water scarcity








# **SDG 7: Affordable clean energy**

Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all

- **7.1**: Ensure universal access to affordable, reliable and modern energy services
- **7.2**: Increase substantially the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix
- **7.3**: Double the global rate of improvement in energy efficiency






### SDG 8: Decent work and economic growth

Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all

#### Investable and acknowledged transformational leadership sub-goals

- **8.4**: Improve global resource efficiency in consumption and production and endeavour to decouple economic growth from environmental degradation
- **8.5**: Achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for work of equal value
- **8.7**: Take immediate and effective measures to eradicate forced labour, end modern slavery and human trafficking and secure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, including recruitment and use of child soldiers, and by 2025 end child labour in all its forms
- **8.8**: Protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments for all workers, including migrant workers, in particular women migrants, and those in precarious employment






# SDG 9: industry, innovation and infrastructure

Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation

- **9.1**: Develop quality, reliable, sustainable and resilient infrastructure, including regional and trans border infrastructure, to support economic development and human well-being, with a focus on affordable and equitable access for all
- **9.3**: Increase the access of small-scale industrial and other enterprises, in particular in developing countries, to financial services, including affordable credit, and their integration into value chains and markets
- **9.4**: Upgrade infrastructure and retrofit industries to make them sustainable, with increased resource-use efficiency and greater adoption of clean and environmentally sound technologies and industrial processes






# **SDG 10: Reduce Inequalities**

10.1: Progressively achieve and sustain income growth of the bottom 40% of the population






#### **SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities**

# Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the Global Partnership for Sustainable Development

- 11.1: Ensure access for all to adequate, safe and affordable housing and basic services and upgrade slums
- **11.2**: Provide access to safe, affordable, accessible and sustainable transport systems for all, improving road safety, notably by expanding public transport
- **11.5**: Significantly reduce the number of deaths and the number of people affected and substantially decrease the direct economic losses relative to global gross domestic product caused by disasters, including water-related disasters, with a focus on protecting the poor and people in vulnerable situations
- **11.6**: Reduce the adverse per capita environmental impact of cities, including by paying special attention to air quality and municipal and other waste management










# **SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production**

#### Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns

- **12.2**: Achieve the sustainable management and efficient use of natural resources
- **12.3**: Halve per capita global food waste at the retail and consumer levels and reduce food losses along production and supply chains, including post-harvest losses
- **12.4**: Achieve the environmentally sound management of chemicals and all wastes throughout their life cycle, and significantly reduce their release to air, water and soil in order to minimize their adverse impacts on human health and the environment
- 12.5: Substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse








#### **SDG 13: Climate Action**

#### Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

- **13.1** Strengthen resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related hazards and natural disasters in all countries
- **13.3** Improve education, awareness-raising and human and institutional capacity on climate change mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction and early warning
- **13.b** Promote mechanisms for raising capacity for effective climate change-related planning and management in least developed countries and small island developing States, including focusing on women, youth and local and marginalized communities







#### SDG 14: Life below water

Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development


#### Investable sub-goals

**14.1**: Prevent and significantly reduce marine pollution of all kinds, in particular from land-based activities, including marine debris and nutrient pollution

**14.2**: Sustainably manage and protect marine and coastal ecosystems to avoid significant adverse impacts, including by strengthening their resilience, and take action for their restoration in order to achieve healthy and productive oceans












#### SDG 15: Life on land

Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss

- **15.1**: Ensure the conservation, restoration and sustainable use of terrestrial and inland freshwater ecosystems and their services, in particular forests, wetlands, mountains and drylands, in line with obligations under international agreements
- **15.2**: Promote the implementation of sustainable management of all types of forests, halt deforestation, restore degraded forests and substantially increase afforestation and reforestation globally
- **15.3**: Combat desertification, restore degraded land and soil, including land affected by desertification, drought and floods, and strive to achieve a land degradation-neutral world
- **15.5**: Take urgent and significant action to reduce the degradation of natural habitats, halt the loss of biodiversity and, by 2020, protect and prevent the extinction of threatened species





# **SDG 16: Peace and Justice Strong institutions**

Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

#### **Investable sub-goals**
